ORDINANCE NO. 599

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORANGE CITY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ADD A NEW SECTION 2.05 REQUIRING ELECTRONIC FILING OF CAMPAIGN TREASURER'S REPORTS WITH THE VOLUSIA COUNTY SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS OFFICE'S ELECTRONIC FILING SYSTEM; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTING PROVISIONS, SEVERABILITY AND APPLICABILITY; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Acknowledgement: The City Clerk must require each person given a secure sign-on to the electronic filing system to sign a written statement on a form prepared by the City Clerk acknowledging the following:

- Campaign finance reports must be completed and filed through the electronic filing system not later than midnight of the day requested by law therefore.
- Campaign finance reports not filed by midnight of the required day are deemed later-filed and are subject to the penalties prescribed under Section 106.07(8), Florida Statutes.
- Campaign finance reports filed through the electronic filing system are considered to be certified as to correctness within the meaning of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes by the candidate and the candidate's treasurer, in case of a candidate, or the political committee's chair and treasurer, in case of the a political committee, and such persons are subject to the provision of Section 106.07(5), Florida Statutes.
- The person signing the statement is responsible for protecting the sign-on credentials from disclosure, and for filing using such credentials, unless the person has notified the Supervisor that such credentials have been compromised.
